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## Words of Confession and Assurance

*Confession means we are completely honest with God and others about our flaws and failures. Instead of hiding in shame or self-defensiveness, we admit our sin, and open ourselves to God's mercy available through Christ alone.*

**1 Peter 5:5-11:** Likewise, you who are younger, be subject to the elders. Clothe yourselves, all of you, with humility toward one another, for “God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble.” Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that at the proper time he may exalt you, casting all your anxieties on him, because he cares for you. Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. Resist him, firm in your faith, knowing that the same kinds of suffering are being experienced by your brotherhood throughout the world.

And after you have suffered a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, confirm, strengthen, and establish you. To him be the dominion forever and ever. Amen.

The bread and the cup do not contain power or grace in themselves; rather, the power and grace are found in Christ, who is spiritually present with us as we partake by faith. Instituted by Jesus, the Lord's Supper is a means of grace that invigorates our faith, calls us to remember his once-for-all sacrifice, and anticipates the future feast we will enjoy with him when he returns.*

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## Scripture Reading - Isaiah 59:14-21

Justice is turned back, and righteousness stands far away; for truth has stumbled in the public squares, and uprightness cannot enter. Truth is lacking, and he who departs from evil makes himself a prey. The Lord saw it, and it displeased him that there was no justice. He saw that there was no man, and wondered that there was no one to intercede; then his own arm brought him salvation, and his righteousness upheld him. He put on righteousness as a breastplate, and a helmet of salvation on his head; he put on garments of vengeance for clothing, and wrapped himself in zeal as a cloak. According to their deeds, so will he repay, wrath to his adversaries, repayment to his enemies; to the coastlands he will render repayment. So they shall fear the name of the Lord from the west, and his glory from the rising of the sun; for he will come like a rushing stream, which the wind of the Lord drives. And a Redeemer will come to Zion, to those in Jacob who turn from transgression, declares the Lord. "And as for me, this is my covenant with them," says the Lord: "My Spirit that is upon you, and my words that I have put in your mouth, shall not depart out of your mouth, or out of the mouth of your offspring, or out of the mouth of your children's offspring," says the Lord, "from this time forth and forevermore."

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# Sermon - Strength to Stand - Ephesians 6:10

“Be strong in the Lord, and the strength of his might.”

Whenever you try to move forward in the Christian life, you will soon feel something pushing back. That resistance isn't just from other people, or your own bad habits, or past wounds—although those are real. The Bible teaches that there are unseen forces arrayed against you, trying to allure you into distrusting God and not loving others. Clearly, the Christian life is not a peaceful journey; it is a spiritual conflict in which we must stand firm. As the Apostle Paul puts it, we must “be strong” so that we can “stand against the schemes of the devil” (6:11). But what is this strength? Where does it come from? And how can it be ours? This passage teaches us that the strength to stand comes **(I)** not from ourselves, **(II)** but from a power beyond us **(III)** that works in and through us.

## **I. The strength to stand does not come from us.**

*“Be strengthened in the Lord”*

- A. We blame our weaknesses on outside problems. - Gen. 3:12
- B. We credit our strengths as coming from ourselves - 2 Chrn. 26:15
- C. But our strength is not sufficient because our foe is stronger than we are. - Eph. 6:11-12; John 15:5

## **II. The strength to stand comes from a power beyond us.**

*“Be strengthened in the Lord and in the power of his might”*

- A. This power reverses death - Eph. 1:19-20
- B. This power reigns over all - Eph. 1:20-21
- C. This power remakes the human heart and society - Eph. 2:1-10; 3:16-17

## **III. The strength to stand is a power that works in and through us.**

*“Be strengthened in the Lord”*

- A. Fact - Jesus shares his power with those who trust in him.
- B. Response - Jesus shares his power so that we will use it.
  - 1. Choose transparency over hiding.
  - 2. Choose obedience over vacillation.
  - 3. Choose unity over division.
  - 4. Choose hope over discouragement.
  - 5. Choose boldness over timidity.

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## Discussion Questions

1. According to Ephesians 6:10–11, what does it mean to “be strong in the Lord,” and what would it look like to obey that command in your daily routines?
2. How does Ephesians 6:12 reshape the way we think about the real source of our struggles? What would change in your response to conflict if you truly believed this?
3. If our strength does not come from ourselves (Ephesians 6:10, John 15:5), what habits or mindsets must we repent of in order to rely more fully on God's power?
4. What are some ways we tend to credit ourselves for spiritual strength, and how can we instead practice humility and dependence?
5. Ephesians 1:19–21 describes God’s power as resurrection power. How should this truth give shape to our response to fear, opposition, or discouragement?
6. Since Christ now reigns “far above all rule and authority” (Ephesians 1:21), what would it look like to live with confidence under his authority instead of being intimidated by worldly powers or cultural pressure?
7. Ephesians 3:16–17 speaks of being strengthened with power “through his Spirit in your inner being.” How can we actively pursue this inner strengthening?
8. The sermon application called us to choose truth, obedience, unity, hope, and boldness. Which of these choices is most urgent for you right now, and what specific step would faithfulness in that area look like this week?
