# The Lord's Supper

*The Lord's Supper proclaims the good news of Jesus in a way that engages our senses. It reminds us that just as our bodies need food and drink to live, our souls need Christ and his saving work for eternal life. The bread and the cup do not contain power or grace in themselves; rather, the power and grace are found in Christ, who is spiritually present with us as we partake by faith. Instituted by Jesus, the Lord's Supper is a means of grace that invigorates our faith, calls us to remember his once-for-all sacrifice, and anticipates the future feast we will enjoy with him when he returns.*

## 1 Corinthians 11:23-29

For I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, "This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also he took the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty concerning the body and blood of the Lord. Let a person examine himself, then, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment on himself.

## Scripture Reading - Titus 1:12-13, 15-16; 3:1-8

One of the Cretans, a prophet of their own, said, “Cretans are always liars, evil beasts, lazy gluttons.” This testimony is true. Therefore rebuke them sharply, that they may be sound in the faith,

To the pure, all things are pure, but to the defiled and unbelieving, nothing is pure; but both their minds and their consciences are defiled. They profess to know God, but they deny him by their works. They are detestable, disobedient, unfit for any good work.

Remind them to be submissive to rulers and authorities, to be obedient, to be ready for every good work, to speak evil of no one, to avoid quarreling, to be gentle, and to show perfect courtesy toward all people. For we ourselves were once foolish, disobedient, led astray, slaves to various passions and pleasures, passing our days in malice and envy, hated by others and hating one another.

But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life. The saying is trustworthy, and I want you to insist on these things, so that those who have believed in God may be careful to devote themselves to good works. These things are excellent and profitable for people.

## Sermon - “Clean and New” - Titus 3:1-8

*Preacher: Jason Armstrong*

Titus was a pastor on Crete—an island like Pinocchio’s Pleasure Island. In Crete, people did whatever they wanted: they lied all the time, never stopped fighting each other, ate too much, and didn’t like hard work. Titus’ job was to teach those who claimed to trust in Jesus to live like Jesus, selflessly loving one another as God loved them. Titus needed to remind them not just *how* to live, but also *why* to live new lives.

- I. We must devote ourselves to doing good to each other because our dirty, old lives are over. (1:12; 3:1-3)
  - A. We are no longer liars, evil brutes, and lazy gluttons—we are now honest, gentle, hard-working and self-controlled. (1:12)
  - B. We are no longer foolish, disobedient, trapped by sin and slaves to comfort and pleasure—we are wise, submissive and free to live in and live out Jesus’ selfless love. (3:3a)
  - C. We no longer envy and hate one another—we now gratefully celebrate each other’s joys in genuine love for one another. (3:3b)
- II. We should devote ourselves to doing good to each other because God’s Spirit has made us clean and new—filled with Jesus’ life and love. (3:4-8)
  - A. God doesn’t save us because of the good things we do, He saves us from the bad things we do. (3:4-5)
  - B. God’s Spirit has washed us clean from the dirt of our sin. (3:5-6)
    - 1. He purifies us because he loves us. (2:14)
    - 2. He purifies us so that we can love him and others. (2:14)
  - C. God’s Spirit has given us new life - the start of heaven’s bright spring at the end of earth’s dark winter! (3:5-8)
    - 1. We are now justified: made right with God.
    - 2. We are now heirs: God’s royal children.
    - 3. We are now empowered by God’s Spirit to love one another.
