Scripture Reading – Isaiah 52:7-10; 53:1-6

52:7 How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings good news, who publishes peace, who brings good news of happiness, who publishes salvation, who says to Zion, “Your God reigns.” **8** The voice of your watchmen—they lift up their voice; together they sing for joy; for eye to eye they see the return of the Lord to Zion. **9** Break forth together into singing, you waste places of Jerusalem, for the Lord has comforted his people; he has redeemed Jerusalem. **10** The Lord has bared his holy arm before the eyes of all the nations, and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God. . . . **53:1** Who has believed what he has heard from us? And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed? **2** For he grew up before him like a young plant, and like a root out of dry ground; he had no form or majesty that we should look at him, and no beauty that we should desire him. **3** He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not. **4** Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. **5** But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed. **6** All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

Sermon – Gospel Readiness

The Bible teaches us that our feet must be fitted with “the readiness given by the gospel of peace” (Ephesians 6:15). In other words, the gospel serves as our spiritual combat footwear. Without it, we are unprepared for battle. But what is the gospel of peace? It is the royal announcement that *Jesus reigns*—and because he reigns, we can have peace with God and others. This good news about peace prepares us for spiritual conflict and enables us to advance in it. That’s why we must be ready not only to stand firm in the gospel, but also to share it.

I. The gospel of peace prepares us for spiritual conflict.

A. What it is: The gospel of peace is the royal proclamation that the crucified and risen Jesus now reigns. - Isaiah 52:7; Romans 10:9

B. Why it prepares us: The gospel of peace prepares us because . . .

1. It puts us at peace with God. - Romans 5:1; Eph. 2:1-10
2. It puts us at peace with others. - Eph. 2:11-22; Col. 3:15
3. It puts us at peace with ourselves. - Phil. 4:6-7; Heb. 9:14

II. Sharing the gospel of peace is how we advance in spiritual conflict.

A. Our adversary Satan blinds people to God’s supreme goodness and glory. - 2 Corinthians 4:3-4

B. The gospel of peace reveals how good, beautiful, and trustworthy God really is. - 2 Corinthians 4:4

III. So let’s prepare to share the gospel of peace.

Discussion Questions

1. What is the gospel, and why does it bring peace?
2. How does Paul's use of the word "peace" elsewhere in his letter to the Ephesians shed more light on the nature of the gospel of peace? See 2:13-14, 17; 4:3.
3. Imagine going into spiritual conflict without a firm grasp on this gospel of peace—without the footwear of gospel readiness. How would this missing piece of armor affect your level of confidence? How would it affect your view of other people?
4. Do you have a firm understanding of the gospel of peace—or do you see the gospel mostly as . . . an escape from hell? a call to improved morals? a script to talk someone through to make sure that they are "saved"? How does your understanding of the gospel need to be corrected and refined?
5. What is your understanding of the relationship between the gospel and good works? Can you credibly share the gospel with someone without being a genuinely good person? Can you share the gospel with someone without using words at all? (*Hint: The simple answer to both questions is no. But why?*)
6. Why is sharing the gospel the way we advance in spiritual conflict? What is true about Satan's "strongholds" that the gospel powerfully topples? (See 2 Corinthians 4:3-4).
7. What are your greatest fears or obstacles when it comes to trying to share the gospel with other people?
8. Are there people in your life who don't know or believe the gospel? Pray that you would have opportunities to share the gospel with them, and ask someone to join you in praying for them.
