Scripture Reading - 1 Corinthians 10:1-15

1 For I do not want you to be unaware, brothers, that our fathers were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea, 2 and all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea, 3 and all ate the same spiritual food, 4 and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank from the spiritual Rock that followed them, and the Rock was Christ. 5 Nevertheless, with most of them God was not pleased, for they were overthrown in the wilderness. 6 Now these things took place as examples for us, that we might not desire evil as they did. 7 Do not be idolaters as some of them were; as it is written, "The people sat down to eat and drink and rose up to play." 8 We must not indulge in sexual immorality as some of them did, and twenty-three thousand fell in a single day. 9 We must not put Christ[c] to the test, as some of them did and were destroyed by serpents, 10 nor grumble, as some of them did and were destroyed by the Destroyer. 11 Now these things happened to them as an example, but they were written down for our instruction, on whom the end of the ages has come. 12 Therefore let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall. 13 No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it. 14 Therefore, my beloved, flee from idolatry. 15 I speak as to sensible people; judge for yourselves what I say.

Sermon - “Desert Lessons Lead us To The Desert Shepherd” - 1 Corinthians 10:1-15

Everyone goes through “desert experiences” when the inevitable trials of life come our way. God uses those desert experiences to lead us to the Desert Shepherd- Jesus Christ. When we find ourselves in the desert, we must learn to look for the desert blossoms that are Christ’s love, grace, and mercy that we may experience the bread of life and the living water that brings relief.

I. The Privileges (vv. 1-5)

We are people of privilege because we can experience God’s plan of redemption. Let us not rest until the essence of who we are is immersed into the essence of who He is.

II. The Punishments (vv. 6-12)

The desert is a time of testing, and we pass the test by trusting.

III. The Promises (vv. 13-14)

Let our desert experiences in life guide us to the Desert Shepherd, and we will emerge from the desert guided by the Desert Shepherd for life.
